In the 2012-2013 school year, Sisters High School earned an overall school rating of level four out of a possible five. The rating components combine achievement, growth, subgroup growth, graduation and subgroup graduation into a complex formula that compares us to all schools statewide. This means our students

are generally outperforming those at like-schools.

As you progress through the report card you will notice that we are above average or in the top 10% in most areas. We are certainly very proud of our accomplishments. Yet, we continue to strive to improve. 

Level 1 = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools


Level 2 = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools
